

Peer-Mentoring Project - Evaluator



Essex County Council

1. Project Background

Essex County Council is seeking expressions of interest from individuals to evaluate a peer-mentoring project, supporting learning staff in Essex museums. The project aims to support staff with responsibility for delivering either formal or informal learning programmes within the county's museums.

Recent restructuring, changes in governance and the National Curriculum have had a strong impact on delivery of learning programmes in Essex museums. Museum educators working in different museums have a range of skills and experience that could be of benefit to their peers. They include Curators, former teachers and Learning Officers with experience working with digital technology, social media or with cross-curricular subjects.

Through this project, participants will be matched with a peer-mentor whose skills and experience is different to their own. They will support each other in increasing their knowledge and act as each other's "sounding board" as they develop their own projects and work schemes. It is important to recognise that in some cases, museums are competing over the same audiences, and this potential conflict-of-interests will be kept in mind as partners are assigned.

The work includes producing an evaluative report of the project, detailing the planning, recruitment and delivery stages and making recommendations for the future.

Specific areas for delivery are:

- Work with the Museum Development Officer and the Project Coordinator to formulate an evaluation plan.
- Attend the four participant group meetings (dates to be confirmed in negotiation between the Museum Development Officer, Project Coordinator and Project Evaluator).
- Capture feedback from the participants, the Museum Development Officer and the Project Coordinator.
- Produce an evaluative report assessing the success of the mentoring scheme and making recommendation as to how it can be taken forward in the future.

The work requires the ability to work flexibly around the county and have access to a laptop computer and mobile phone. The report is to be delivered by 31st March 2016.

2. Technical Requirements

- Knowledge of the museum sector, particularly with regard to museum learning.

- Experience of evaluating projects in a freelance capacity
- Ability to work flexibly in order to meet the needs of the project.

3. Budget:

- £275 per day for 10 days, totalling £2750. Two-thirds (£1833) to be paid in advance, with the final instalment of £917 to be paid upon completion of the project.
- Expenses, including travel costs, to be agreed in advance with the Museum Development Officer

If you are invited to interview, you will be asked to give a 5 to 10 minute presentation on how you would approach the project.
